Opportunities to Serve!

Need A: Home Projects (variety)

Immediate Volunteer Need! January 5th Afternoon. I need at least 3 people to help me move a woman from one home to another home. 3 hours max. Others:

- Painting a neighbor's exterior home. ~5, ~4 hours
- 2 Yard cleaning. 4-8 people, ~5 to 6 hours
- 2 Wood ramp construction project ~6 to 8 hours. ~5 people (2 skilled workers)

Need B: Home Delivery

About every week, I go on a route to gather and distribute furniture. We need 2-3 more able-bodied volunteers to add into the rotation to move and deliver furniture to our neighbors. I ask an average of one morning volunteered a month, usually a Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday morning. About 3-4 hours.

Need C: Visitation

We are starting a formal visitation ministry to isolated (and usually elderly or disabled) women in our community. If you are an interested woman, please contact Lenora@cccgainesville.org if you are interested in participating in this way to show love through physical presence, community, and kindness to those who do not get much of that in their lives.
