

### 2023 Annual Report

To God be the glory!



# Every one of these metrics is an increase from 2022!

Home Delivery covers everything we have delivered to our neighbor in 2023, and Home Projects include our ramp projects, our group yard or home cleaning projects, and other special projects.

Every service we deliver to our neighbors is almost always accompanied by the message that God is a gracious God who is providing physically for the neighbor, but also that the work of CCC is an image of the saving love of Jesus.



### **Budget and Income**

For 2023, CCC brought in about 600 dollars more than in 2022, ending the year with a slight surplus! God is good in providing for us, with a very large year-end giving season that pushed us into positive territory, and leading us in the right direction financially! This has been a point of focus for the Board and Michael, as we need to raise income to above the current average in order to achieve sustainability for budget moving forward. Continue to pray that more partners would join as financial donors, and that CCC would steward our resources well in the goal of fulfilling our mission.

What an encouraging year the Lord has given us. We hired Michael as our executive director, and he has stepped into the role with enthusiasm, love for our neighbors, and love for the work itself. His desire to see our community thrive and connect the resources of God's people with our neighbors in need has had tremendous fruit. With the amazing work and support of Lenora who continues to be our front line for neighbors to connect, CCC has been able to deliver beds and furniture, build ramps,

clean yards and homes, and so much more. My own small group was able to work with CCC on a service project that raked and bagged over 30 bags of leaves from a neighbor's yard. To see all of our kids enjoying the work of raking leaves together for the purpose of serving the people who lived there was truly a joy. There were a few competitions and exclamations of wonder as we bagged more and more leaves.

My calling as a teacher comes from my desire to care for my community as kids pass through my classroom. I have always been content to be in the place I am because there is so much work the Lord is doing in the lives of people in my place. I will never exhaust the opportunities to join with Him in caring for my neighbors. This is why CCC is so important to me. I have served on the board this past year with fellow members who are filled with the love of God that flows into their love of their neighbors. As we have gone about continuing the work that has been started so long ago I am thankful for your support. Whether you have recently joined our team, you have rejoined, or have been faithfully supporting CCC for years (if not decades!), we are so thankful for your generosity that we might serve and love our neighbors in the name of Jesus.
